## **General Summary:**

At the direction of the Senior Audio Video Specialist, installs, tests, and troubleshoots communication network cabling, surveillance cameras, and other equipment as required. Assists Network Administrators in network maintenance and equipment deployment.

## **Essential Duties:**

Correctly install, terminate, test, and troubleshoot Category 3, 6, and 6a copper cables; single-mode fiber optic cable; and multi-mode fiber optic cable while coordinating with various departments to complete tasks in a timely and efficient manner.

Install, test, and configure IP-based surveillance cameras, overhead projectors and other equipment as required.

Attend training seminars, read on-line news releases and professional periodicals, and meet with vendors to keep up with technological advancements in the industry, current standards.

Work with outside contractors to install and terminate aerial and underground cable installations.

Assist Network Administrators with network maintenance and with configuration/deployment of equipment.

May be on-call and some overtime and/or weekend/holiday work may be required.
