RESOLUTION APPROVING THE DISSOLUTION OF THE BRAZOS COUNTY
INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION; AND APPROVING OTHER
MATTERS RELATING THERETO

WHEREAS, Brazos County Industrial Development Corporation was incorporated on February 21, 1980, as a Texas nonprofit industrial development corporation (the "Corporation") under certain provisions of the Development Corporation Act of 1979 (the "Act") now codified under Chapter 501, Local Government Code, as amended ("Chapter 501"), with the approval of the governing body of Brazos County (the "County"); and

WHEREAS, the Corporation was organized exclusively for the purposes of benefiting and accomplishing public purposes of and to act on behalf of Brazos County, Texas for the promotion and development of commercial, industrial, and manufacturing enterprises and to promote and encourage employment and the public welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation has not been utilized and desires to remove any administrative burdens related thereto, and therefore adopted a resolution on May 9, 2023 attached hereto as Exhibit A requesting that the County move forward with the dissolution of the Corporation; and

WHEREAS, the County believes it to be in the best interest of the County to terminate the existence of the Corporation; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 501 permits the County in its sole discretion as the authorizing unit for the Corporation, to terminate the existence of the Corporation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF BRAZOS COUNTY, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. The County does hereby authorize the termination of the Corporation subject to the provisions of the Act and Chapter 501, and subject to any limitation provided by the constitution and laws of the State of Texas.

Section 2. The termination of the Corporation will not result in the impairment of contracts entered into by the Corporation.

Section 3. The County Judge, County Clerk, and Counsel are authorized, empowered and directed to (a) sign, execute, deliver and file the Certificate of Termination and any and all such other documents and instruments as may be required by the Secretary of State of Texas, (b) distribute the Corporation's assets to the County in accordance with articles of incorporation for the Corporation and laws of the State of Texas, and (c) do and perform or cause to be done and performed any acts and things as such officer shall deem necessary, advisable or convenient in order to wind up and otherwise effect the termination of the Corporation.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be liberally construed to evidence the intent of the County to comply with state law requiring termination of a development corporation to be authorized only by a written resolution of the County's governing body.
