Acknowledgment of use of the Rural Law Enforcement Grant funds for FY 2026.

The rural Law Enforcement grant funds may be used to supplement salaries, create new positions, purchase safety equipment, purchase firearms, and purchase vehicles. The Sheriff's Office will be using these funds for the following:

- Vehicle
  - 2026 Ford F550 18' Mobile Command/Crisis Negotiations Vehicle and Equipment- \$324,445\*
    - A Mobile Command/Communications Vehicle is essential to support effective response and coordination during emergencies, large-scale incidents, and major public events. It provides a centralized, on-site command center that enables real-time communication and collaboration among law enforcement, fire, EMS, and partner agencies.
    - This capability ensures continuity of operations when traditional infrastructure is limited or unavailable, improving situational awareness, response efficiency, and decision-making. In addition to emergency response, the vehicle supports planned events, training, and regional coordination efforts. Investing in this resource enhances the County's preparedness, strengthens interagency communication, and improves the overall safety and protection of the community.
    - Radio and computer equipment transform a mobile command vehicle into a centralized hub for communication and decision-making. Radios provide real-time, interoperable communication between agencies, ensuring coordination even when traditional systems fail.
