## **BRAZOS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT**

## REGULAR MEETING

A regular meeting of the Commissioners' Court of Brazos County, Texas was held in the Brazos County Commissioners Courtroom in the Administration Building, 200 South Texas Avenue, in Bryan, Brazos County, Texas, beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, April 25, 2017 with the following members of the Court present:

Duane Peters, County Judge, Presiding; Steve Aldrich, Commissioner of Precinct 1; Sammy Catalena, Commissioner of Precinct 2; Nancy Berry, Commissioner of Precinct 3; Irma Cauley, Commissioner of Precinct 4; Karen McQueen, County Clerk.

The attached sheets contain the names of the citizens and officials that were in attendance.

College Station resident Vonda Bob spoke to the Court about her complaint against an employee of the Health Department. Mrs. Bob said that Nathan Curt Johnson is unprofessional and has yelled at people for minor infractions. She said that she has contacted his supervisors about his behavior but he will then retaliate. Mrs. Bob said Mr. Johnson is rude to both homeowners and professionals in the septic business. She said he is not willing to work with people at all. She also said she believes he has singled her customers out as a retaliation to her by sending her customers letters. Mrs. Bob said that he asks her customers to provide materials for ATCs that are not required

by anyone including TCEQ, but he will require it before authorizing the ATC. She said that Mr. Johnson has a felony conviction for cocaine in 1992 and served 10 years on Community Supervision, and believes that should prohibit him from being licensed. Mrs. Bob also said that Mr. Johnson has accused her of not turning in an application, but she said she did turn it into Mr. Johnson's supervisor and believes that he lost the application.

Judge Peters asked Mrs. Bob if she has had the opportunity to speak with the Health Board.

Mrs. Bob said she has talked with Don Plitt, Ken Bost and Bill Ballard. She said that she has tried multiple times to have a meeting but after Mr. Johnson filed on her business she feels she is being ignored.

Bill Ballard, Civil Counsel, informed Mrs. Bob that the Court could not respond to her at this time and that Mr. Johnson is not a Brazos County employee.

Bryan resident Mike Southerland then asked to speak. He said that although he is a member of the Bryan City Council, he is speaking as an individual and no one on the Bryan City Council has approved his remarks. He said he is speaking on Agenda Item 18. He believes that the petition does not meet the requirements. Mr. Southerland said that the signatures must be verified. Mr. Southerland said he does not understand why this is being done since Blinn already provides quality education. He urges the Court to review this petition carefully and determine if it is legal.

Travis Everson with Auction House, LLC. spoke next and told the Court that his company is an on-line auction website dedicated to Tax Sale auctions. He said by using the on-line system they are able to interact with bidders, increase the number of bidders and county revenue. Mr. Everson said this will not cost the county anything since the bidders pay a fee. He mentioned he would like to come back for a workshop on this topic.



## **Auction**House

### WHAT WE DO:

Auction House (AH) is an on-line live auction website dedicated to Tax Sale auctions. We offer County governments the opportunity to increase county revenues and bolster their tax rolls by bringing online bidders to compete with bidders present at the live auction at the county courthouse steps, all in real-time. Historically bidders were required to be present to bid at tax sale auctions; this is no longer the case for Texas. Our website is a tool that will allow County governments to increase the revenue generated by these auctions by providing the following to its bidders:

- 1. <u>Convenience</u> No longer is it necessary for bidders to be present at the auctions. Now bidders can compete in auctions all across the state with live on-site bidders in each county. The AH website is mobile friendly across all mobile devices.
- 2. <u>Expanded Customer Base</u> Our website will increase the number and quality of bidders participating in these auctions. This drives increased revenue for the County government and the County as a whole.
- 3. <u>Security</u> The AH website is a secure way to purchase auctioned property. Bidders purchase property at auction using our secure payment services and pay the County directly using our secure servers through Digital Check, wire transfer or ACH payment.
- 4. <u>Bidder Confidence & Experience</u> We offer a fun and competitive bidding experience that is easy to use, is easy on the eyes and provides transparency to all bidders whether they are live on-line or live on-site.

### **USING OUR SITE:**

On-line bidders must be approved by each county prior to bidding on property in that county. Users can browse the AH website and those properties available for auction. Once a user is registered with an AH account they can use our Watch List feature to track and rank certain properties, and utilize GIS mapping and other features of the website. Only bidders who are registered and approved to bid by the County will be able to bid on any property auction for that county.


Auctions are held one day per month, or at the County's discretion. The auction will begin with the first lot available at 10:00 am. Once that lot is closed the auction moves to the next property available, and so on until all of the auctions have closed. Each auction lasts a minimum of two minutes. Each bid within the last 10 seconds of the two minute period will extend the timer an additional 20 seconds. This process is repeated until one successful bidder is remaining and the timer has reached zero.

Each property has a minimum bid (reserve) amount that is set by the County or its legal representatives. Each auction opens at the minimum bid amount. All property will be sold to the highest bidder if that bid is greater than the minimum bid (reserve) amount. Bids must be submitted in increments of \$100.00 (or an increment set by the County).

The successful on-line bidder will have 60 minutes to complete the claim process and make the final payment through the AH website. In the event that the successful on-line bidder does not claim the property in the given time frame, the successful bidder will lose their preauthorization/deposit money and potentially forfeit their use of the AH website forever.

The successful bidder will receive a deed without warranty from the County in which the auction was won. Deeds will be sent to the successful bidder in a timely manner in accordance with the County's practices.

## Step 1 – County Benefits

Texas Counties can partner with Auction House to auction tax sale properties live at the County Courthouse auction and on-line simultaneously.

Auction House provides a convenient auction and payment process. Fast and secure payments are collected and sent directly from the bidder to the county after each auction.

Auction House online auctions reach a nationwide customer/bidder base, thus increasing exposure and county revenues.

## Step 3 – Bidder Auction Process

Bidders can select auctions by County or narrow the search using other numerous parameters and GIS map features.

Bidders can add and track property auctions using the Watch List feature.

Bidders compete in live <u>simultaneous auctions</u> where online bidders bid against bidders who are present at the on-site county courthouse auction, all in real-time.

Bidders can make offers on Struck-Off properties using the "Make An Offer" button.

## Step 2 - Bidder Registration

Users must first register online using a Bidder ID Number that is generated and verified by each County. This will provide additional revenue for the county by increasing the number of \$10 processing fees collected.

After registration, a preauthorization on the user's Credit Card will be held in order for users to participate on auction day.

The Preauthorization is released at the end of each bidding day for all users; except in the event of non-payment by the winning bidder.

## Step 4 – Bidder Payment

Once the auction is complete and a winner is declared, payment must be made within 60 minutes (Timer Enforced).

User has the ability to pay by Virtual Check, Wire Transfer or ACH Payment.

Full payment is made by the winning bidder which includes all legal and technical fees.

If a user wins an auction but fails to make payment, the user forfeits the credit card preauthorization amount and the property is put up for auction again.

Brazos County Commissioners Court is pleased to support Texas A&M Physicians College of Medicine's application to the US Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to be a designated federally qualified health center lookalike status (FQHC-LAL) in an effort to increase access to care for low and moderate-income clients. Texas A&M Physicians provides a full range of health and social services and is prepared to add additional services like dentistry which would be required by FQHC-LAL status.

The Texas A&M Physicians practice will provide free and low-cost healthcare services to low income residents in Bryan, College Station and the surrounding counties. While there are providers in Bryan-College Station which accept Medicare/Medicaid as well as treat the uninsured, the demand for services far outweighs current resources. Many residents choose the emergency department for medical care because they cannot get a timely appointment in the available clinics and limitations in the transportation systems make it difficult to access care outside of usual working hours. As evidenced by a local care navigation system, many of these patients have not been able to get appointments at local facilities even after having made an emergency department visit.

Texas A&M Physicians aims to improve the care and services of all persons in the region through a full range of primary care including pediatric and obstetrical care. Because they are a teaching program, they will introduce learners to the problems faced by low income individuals including the impact of lack of insurance or having an insurance plan that is not widely accepted by providers in the area.

I commend Texas A&M Physicians for this proposal and strongly support its application, knowing that upon its FQHC-LAL designation, they will be able to expand access to healthcare services in the region and improve the health statistics of the Brazos Valley. I urge HRSA's full consideration and favorable decision on funding for this proposal.

## Unclaimed Property Capital Credits for Counties

Glenn Hegar

Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts In conjunction with Local Government Code 381.004 and Texas Property Code Section 74.602, the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts is authorized to distribute a portion of unclaimed capital credits to counties for specific uses.

## What are unclaimed capital credits?

Electric cooperatives that have lost contact with a previous customer sometimes report capital credits to the Comptroller's office as unclaimed property. Texas law allows counties to claim a portion of unclaimed capital credits originating from their county and use them for specific programs.

## How are funds divided among counties?

- Electric cooperatives report to the Comptroller unclaimed capital credits and the county of service from which they originated.
- The amount available to each county is based on that county's total capital credits remitted per reporting year, minus anticipated claims as determined by the Comptroller.
- A county may or may not receive funds in a given year.

## Who qualifies?

- Any county can request a portion of those funds.
- The county must follow instructions in Local Government Code Section 381.004 to request funds.
- The commissioners court is the primary governing body and ultimate decision-making authority on the legitimacy of fund requests.

## General uses of capital credits

The county commissioners court may use capital credits to develop and administer a program:\*

- · for state or local economic development
- for small or disadvantaged business development
- to stimulate, encourage and develop business location and commercial activity in the county
- to promote or advertise the county and its vicinity or conduct a solicitation program to attract conventions, visitors and businesses
- to improve the extent to which women and minority businesses are awarded county contracts
- to support comprehensive literacy programs that benefit county residents
- for the encouragement, promotion, improvement and application of the arts
- · to support a children's advocacy center

## How to request capital credits

The county judge and/or commissioners court must complete and submit the form on the back of this notice.

- The form must be signed by a representative of the commissioners court or the county judge.
- The form must include the complete name, address and federal tax identification number of the commissioners court. Funds will be paid directly to the court.

## ORDER AMENDING RULES AND PROCEDURES OF BRAZOS COUNTY

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 296 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, the Brazos County Commissioners Court created the Brazos County Local Provider Participation Fund;

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Local Provider Participation Fund is to generate revenue to provide the nonfederal share of a Medicaid supplemental payment program by requiring a mandatory payment from institutional health care providers in Brazos County;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 296.053 of the Texas Health and Safety Code, Brazos County approved and adopted rules governing the operation of the Local Provider Participation Fund, including rules relating to the administration of a mandatory payment;

WHEREAS, Brazos County desires to now amend the rules of the local provider participation fund.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED by Brazos County that the Brazos COUNTY HEALTH CARE PROVIDER PARTICIPATION PROGRAM MODEL RULES AND PROCEDURES be amended as follows:

## BRAZOS COUNTY HEALTH CARE PROVIDER PARTICIPATION PROGRAM RULES AND PROCEDURES (as Amended April 25, 2017)

## **General Provisions**

- Rule 1. Definitions. In these rules and procedures:
- (a) "Mandatory payment" means a mandatory payment authorized under Subtitle D of Title 4 of the Texas Health & Safety Code.
- (b) "Institutional health care provider" means a nonpublic hospital that provides inpatient hospital services.
- (c) "Paying hospital" means an institutional health care provider required to make a mandatory payment.
- (d) "Program" means a county health care provider participation program authorized under Subtitle D of Title 4 of the Texas Health & Safety Code.
- (e) "Fiscal Year" shall mean September 1 through August 31 of any given year.
  - (f) "County" shall mean Brazos County.

## Rule 2. County Health Care Provider Participation Program; Participation in Program.

- (a) A county health care provider participation program authorizes a county to collect a mandatory payment from each institutional health care provider located in the county to be deposited in a local provider participation fund established by the county. Money in the fund may be used by the county to fund certain intergovernmental transfers and indigent care programs as provided by these rules and procedures.
- (b) The Brazos County Commissioners Court may adopt an order authorizing the County to participate in the program, subject to the limitations provided by these rules and procedures.
- (c) To the extent any provision or procedure under Subtitle D of Title 4 of the Texas Health & Safety Code causes a mandatory payment to be ineligible for federal matching funds, the county may provide by rule for an alternative provision or procedure that conforms to the requirements of the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

## **Powers and Duties of Commissioners Court**

- Rule 3. Limitation on Authority to Require Mandatory Payment. The County may require a mandatory payment from an institutional health care provider only in the manner provided in these rules and procedures.
- Rule 4. Majority Vote Required Prior to Mandatory Payment. The County may not collect a mandatory payment without an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the commissioners court.

## Rule 5. Institutional Health Care Provider Reporting; Inspection of Records.

- (a) The County shall require each institutional health care provider to submit to the County a copy of any financial and utilization data required by and reported to the Department of State Health Services under Texas Health & Safety Code Sections 311.032 and 311.033 and any rules adopted by the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission to implement those sections.
- (b) The County may inspect the records of an institutional health care provider to the extent necessary to ensure that the provider has submitted all required data under this Rule.

## **General Financing Provisions**

## Rule 6. Hearing.

- (a) Each year, the County Commissioners Court shall hold a public hearing on the amounts of any mandatory payments that the Commissioners Court intends to require during the year and how the revenue derived from those payments is to be spent.
- (b) Not later than the 5th day before the date of the hearing required under Rule 6(a), the County Commissioners Court shall publish notice of the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the County.
- (c) A representative of a paying hospital is entitled to appear at the time and place designated in the public notice and to be heard regarding any matter related to the mandatory payments.

### Rule 7. Depository.

- (a) The County shall designate one or more banks located in the County as the depository for mandatory payments received by the County. A bank designated as a depository serves for two years or until a successor is designated.
- (b) All income received by a County under these rules and procedures, including the revenue from mandatory payments remaining after fees for assessing and collecting the payments are deducted, shall be deposited with the County depository in the County's local provider participation fund and may be withdrawn only as provided by these rules and procedures.
- (c) All funds under these rules and procedures shall be secured in the manner provided for securing County funds.

## Rule 8. Local Provider Participation Fund; Authorized Uses of Money.

- (a) The County shall create a local provider participation fund.
- (b) The local provider participation fund of the County consists of:

- (1) all revenue received by the County attributable to mandatory payments, including any penalties and interest attributable to delinquent payments;
- (2) money received from the Health and Human Services Commission as a refund of an intergovernmental transfer from the County to the state for the purpose of providing the nonfederal share of Medicaid supplemental payment program payments, provided that the intergovernmental transfer does not receive a federal matching payment; and
  - (3) the earnings of the fund.
- (c) The County will use the money deposited to the local provider participation fund only for the following purposes:
  - (1) fund intergovernmental transfers from the District to the state to provide:
- (A) the nonfederal share of a Medicaid supplemental payment program authorized under the state Medicaid plan, the Texas Healthcare Transformation and Quality Improvement Program waiver issued under Section 1115 of the federal Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. Section 1315), or a successor waiver program authorizing similar Medicaid supplemental payment programs; or
- (B) payments to Medicaid managed care organizations that are dedicated for payment to hospitals;
  - (2) subsidize indigent programs;
  - (3) pay the administrative expenses of the District;
- (4) refund a portion of a mandatory payment collected in error from a paying hospital;
- (5) refund to paying hospitals the proportionate share of money received by the District from the Health and Human Services Commission that is not used to fund the nonfederal share of Medicaid supplemental payment program payments; and
- (6) refund to paying hospitals the proportionate share of money that the District determines cannot be used to fund the nonfederal share of Medicaid supplemental payment program payments.
- (d) Money in the local provider participation fund may not be commingled with other County funds.
- (e) An intergovernmental transfer of funds described by Rule 8(c)(1) and any funds received by the County as a result of an intergovernmental transfer described by that rule may not be used by the County or any other entity to expand Medicaid eligibility under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Pub. L. No. 111-148) as

amended by the Health Care and Education Reconciliation Act of 2010 (Pub. L. No. 111-152).

## **Mandatory Payments**

Rule 9. Mandatory Payments Based on Paying Hospital Net Patient Revenue.

- (a) Except as provided by Rule 11, the Commissioners Court of a County that collects a mandatory payment may require an annual mandatory payment to be assessed on the net patient revenue of each institutional health care provider located in the County.
- (b) The Commissioners Court may provide for the mandatory payment to be assessed annually. Mandatory payments are typically due no later than the end of the fiscal year.
- (c) In the first year in which the mandatory payment is required, the mandatory payment is assessed based on the data for 2013 collected pursuant to Section 5(a). If no such data are available for an institutional health care provider, the mandatory payment may be calculated based on the institutional health care provider's Medicare cost report submitted for the 2013 fiscal year or for the closest subsequent fiscal year for which the provider submitted the Medicare cost report.
- (d) The County shall update the amount of the mandatory payment on an annual basis.
- (e) If the County selects a new net patient revenue base year and full-year data for a hospital is unavailable, the County may project a hospital's base year net patient revenue either by extrapolating available partial year data from the base year or by using published data from the most recent fiscal year available..

## Rule 10. Mandatory Payment Requirements

- (a) The amount of a mandatory payment must be uniformly proportionate with the amount of net patient revenue generated during the most recent complete fiscal year by each paying hospital in the County (b) The Commissioners Court of the County shall set the amount of the mandatory payment.
- (b) Subject to the maximum amount prescribed by Rule 11(a), the Commissioners Court of the County shall set the mandatory payments in amounts that in the aggregate will generate sufficient revenue to cover the administrative expenses of the County for activities under these rules and procedures and to fund purposes described in Rule 8(c). The annual amount of revenue from mandatory payments used for administrative expenses of the County for activities under these rules and procedures shall be the lesser of four percent of the total revenue generated from the mandatory payment or \$20,000.
  - (c) The County shall invoice the Paying Hospitals once per fiscal year.

## Rule 11. Mandatory Payment Prohibitions.

- (a) The amount of the mandatory payment required of each paying hospital may not exceed an amount that, when added to the amount of the mandatory payments required from all other paying hospitals in the County, equals an amount of revenue that exceeds six percent of the aggregate net patient revenue of all paying hospitals in the County.
- (b) A mandatory payment may not hold harmless any institutional health care provider, as required under 42 U.S.C. Section 1396b(w).
- (c) A Paying Hospital may not add a mandatory payment required under this section as a surcharge to a patient.
- (d) If a County determines that administration of mandatory payments is increasing the costs of health care to the residents of the County, the Commissioners Court may rescind participation in the program and refund to each paying hospital the proportionate share of any money remaining in the local provider participation fund at the time the County's participation is rescinded.

## Rule 12. Assessment and Collection of Mandatory Payments.

- (a) Except as provided by Rule 12(b), the County tax assessor-collector shall collect the mandatory payment. The County tax assessor-collector shall charge and deduct from mandatory payments collected for the County a fee for collecting the mandatory payment in an amount determined by the Commissioners Court of the County, not to exceed the County tax assessor-collector's usual and customary charges.
- (b) The Commissioners Court may contract for the assessment and collection of mandatory payments in the manner provided by Title 1, Tax Code, for the assessment and collection of ad valorem taxes.
- (c) Revenue from a fee charged by a County tax assessor-collector for collecting the mandatory payment shall be deposited in the County general fund and, if appropriate, shall be reported as fees of the County tax assessor-collector.
- Rule 13. Interest and Penalties. Any interest and penalties on mandatory payments are governed by the law applicable to County ad valorem taxes. Discounts applicable to County ad valorem taxes do not apply.

# AGREEMENT BETWEEN BRAZOS COUNTY AND BRAZOS VALLEY MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY FOR THE OPERATION OF BOONVILLE HERITAGE PARK

- 1. That, upon the terms and conditions herein expressed and in consideration of the covenants and agreements herein expressed, the County does hereby grant unto Museum the right to use and temporarily occupy the space known as the Boonville Heritage Park located at 2421 Boonville Road, Bryan, Brazos County, Texas including the buildings, structures, paths, and equipment (defined in the Attached Exhibit "A"). Hereinafter ("Park or Premises").
- 2. This Agreement allows for the temporary and occasional use of the Premises by Museum for the purpose of conducting tours, school field trips, and educational demonstrations.
- 3. It is anticipated that Museum will need use of the Premises for approximately twenty (20) hours every week. This Agreement shall have an initial term of one year beginning April 25, 2017, and shall expire April 24, 2018.
- 4. The County will make every attempt to accommodate Museum if a request is made for a particular action on the Premises (like mowing, repairs, chairs, etc., road work, heating & cooling, security alarm), but the County cannot guaranty said action. Museum acknowledges by its execution of this Agreement that the County may limit availability of the Premises to the Museum by any means.
- 5. Museum shall have possession of the Premises for the purpose and term aforesaid necessary to accommodate the purpose of the Museum.
- 6. Museum will furnish all equipment and personnel needed to conduct tours of the Premises. County will only make available the Premises at reasonable hours between sunrise and sunset.
- 7. Museum shall return the Premises in as near the same condition as when received. Before leaving the Premises, Museum or Museum's agent shall remove any equipment brought by Museum to the Premises.
- 8. Both Parties agree to accept responsibility for the actions of their employees or agents and will not seek to hold the other Party responsible.

- 9. To the extent allowed by the law and the constitution of the State of Texas, County agrees to hold harmless Museum, its officers, agents, elected officials and employees from and against any and all claims, losses, damages, causes of action, suits and liability of every kind, including all expenses of litigation, court costs and attorney's fees, for injury to or death of any person, or damage to any property, or for any breach of contract arising out of or in connection with this Agreement and the purposes for which this Agreement was entered into, including but not limited to property damage, injuries and death due to the act, omission, mistake, fault, default, or negligence of (1) Museum, its agents and employees; and (2) any invitee's, licensees or guests of Museum and (3) the passive negligence or vicarious Liability of the Museum, its officers, agents, or employees.
- 10. To the extent allowed by the law and the constitution of the State of Texas, Museum agrees to hold harmless County, its officers, agents, elected officials and employees from and against any and all claims, losses, damages, causes of action, suits and liability of every kind, including all expenses of litigation, court costs and attorney's fees, for injury to or death of any person, or damage to any property, or for any breach of contract arising out of or in connection with this Agreement and the purposes for which this Agreement was entered into, including but not limited to property damage, injuries and death due to the act, omission, mistake, fault, default, or negligence of (1) County, its agents and employees; and (2) any invitee's, licensees or guests of County and (3) the passive negligence or vicarious Liability of the County, its officers, agents, or employees.
- 11. Museum may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause.
- 12. County may terminate this Agreement at any time, with or without cause, but must give Museum thirty (30) days' notice prior to termination, either written or oral.
- 13.In the event the Premises or any building or structure located on the Premises is destroyed by fire or other cause, or of any other casualty or unforeseen occurrence or other causes shall render the fulfillment of this Agreement by the County impossible, then the term of this Agreement shall end.
- 14. Museum hereby waives and releases any claim for damages or compensation on account of any termination of this Agreement.
- 15. Neither party shall be liable in damages for any delay or default in performing hereunder if such delay or default is caused by conditions beyond its control including, Acts of God, Government restrictions, wars, insurrections, natural disasters or other emergencies as declared by Federal, State or County agencies or departments.

To the Board of Directors of Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce (the Chamber) (a nonprofit organization), which comprise the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets—modified cash basis as of September 30, 2016, and the related statements of revenues, expenses and changes in net assets—modified cash basis, functional expenses—modified cash basis, and cash flows—modified cash basis, for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

# Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 1; this includes determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the preparation of the financial statements in the circumstances. # Note 1 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce (the Chamber) has functioned continuously under a variety of names since 1918, and was incorporated in 1950. The Chamber's purpose is to unite business, civic, academia and government leaders with leadership driven programs and special events. The Chamber is the only Chamber whose purpose is to promote local businesses. It serves as the voice of the business community to local, county, state and nationally elected-officials. The Chamber is funded primarily through membership dues from local businesses and its programs and events, and is governed by a group of its members who volunteer their time.

# Financial Statement Presentation

The Chamber is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted, and permanently restricted. At September 30, 2016, the Chamber had no restricted net assets.

## **Basis of Accounting**

The Chamber's financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting which is a basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. Under the modified cash basis of accounting, income is recognized when it is received and expenses are recognized when they are paid. In addition, under the modified cash basis of accounting, long-term assets and long-term liabilities are recorded (fixed assets and notes payable). The Chamber has also chosen to record advance deposits and payroll liabilities as current liabilities.

# Fixed Assets and Depreciation

The Chamber capitalizes, at cost, all expenditures for fixed assets in excess of \$1,000. Assets are depreciated using the straight-line method over their estimated useful lives. The cost of maintenance and repairs is charged to expense as paid; significant renewals and betterments are capitalized. Depreciation expense for the year ended September 30, 2016 was \$10,715.

# Cash and Cash Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Chamber considers all unrestricted highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of twelve months or less to be cash equivalents.

# Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

# Note 1 – Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

### Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The carrying amounts of cash equivalents and current liabilities approximate fair value because of the short maturity of those instruments.

## **Advance Deposits**

The Chamber records as a liability membership dues and event deposits received in advance. These amounts will be recognized as revenue in the year they are earned.

#### Note 2 - Tax Status

The Chamber is a tax-exempt non-profit Chamber under Internal Revenue Code 501(c)(6). However, the Chamber is subject to unrelated business income tax on its advertising income generated from the membership directory and other materials. For the year ended September 30, 2016, the Chamber had no tax liability on its unrelated business income tax return.

## Note 3 - Related Party Transactions

The Chamber has a related entity, the Bryan-College Station Chamber of Commerce Foundation (a 501(c)(3)), which was created to provide support for the Chamber. There were no transactions between the two Chambers during the year ended September 30, 2016.

During the year ended September 30, 2016, the Chamber paid Brewer, Eyeington, Patout & Co, LLP for accounting services totaling \$7,325. The firm's senior partner is the father of the new president and CEO of the Chamber.

# Note 4 - Compensated Absences

Full-time employees accrue vacation and sick leave. Unused vacation may be reimbursed upon termination of employment. Unused sick leave is not reimbursed.

#### Note 5 - Pension Plan

The Chamber has a defined contribution pension plan for its employees. Generally, all full-time employees are participants after one year of service. The employer contribution rate is 8% of total compensation, split between discretionary profit sharing (5%) and required safe harbor (3%). Vesting occurs over a graduated six-year period. Total employer contributions for the year ended September 30, 2016 was \$20,609.

#### Note 6 - Leases

The Chamber rents a postage machine under an operating lease requiring quarterly payments of \$516 and expiring in 2019. Rent paid during the year ended September 30, 2016 was \$2,064. The Chamber also rents office space under a lease agreement requiring base rental of \$4,014 per month plus common area fees of \$1,541; this lease expires in 2017. Office rent paid during the year ended September 30, 2016 was \$66,665. Future rent payments due under these leases are as follows:

#### Note 8 - Cash in Excess of FDIC Limits

The Chamber maintains cash in a local bank. The balance at times exceeds the \$250,000 insured limit of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. The Chamber has experienced no losses in such accounts and believes it is not exposed to any significant credit risk on cash.

# Note 9 – Subsequent Events

The Chamber has evaluated subsequent events through February 2, 2017, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
